

ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

The world today is grappling with an alarming rise in religious and communal discord, most of which is fueled by misinformation and false propaganda. Islamophobic campaigns across the globe seek to misrepresent Prophet Muhammad as a promoter of religious bigotry and fanaticism. This distorted portrayal, often amplified by biased interpretations from certain orientalists, has hindered the pursuit of harmony and coexistence. These prejudiced campaigns are cultivating an environment that fuels conflict between civilizations instead of promoting meaningful dialogue. To protect human civilisation from the catastrophic fallout of such discord, it is essential to foster an environment of mutual respect and understanding among world religions.

The life and teachings of Prophet Muḥammad exemplify peace and tranquillity and serve as a profound model for promoting mutual respect, reverence, and unity within diversity. The manifestation of prophetic model of mutual respect and understanding among world religions is found in historical treaties like Ḥilf al-Fuçlūl in Makkah, Muwākhāt, Mīthāq al-Madīnah, Treaty of Ḥudaybiyyah etc. Similarly, the conduct of Saḥābah during their saty in Ḥabashah (Abyssinia) forms the basis of interfaith dialogue from an Islamic perespective. In Madīnah, Prophet Muḥammad made a concerted effort to engage with Jews and other communities, thereby resulting in the enactment of Mīthāq al-Madīnah which is recognised as the world's first written constitution. This treaty underscores Islam's recognition of the fundamental principles of mutual collaboration in social and political spheres with diverse communities. Furthermore, Prophet's dialogue with the Christians of Nairān and

delegations from different parts of the Arabian peninsula is yet another significant example of Prophetic model of fostering mutual respect and harmony among differnt religions.

In order to create a better appreciation of Prophetic model of fostering peace and harmony among world religions, International Centre for Spiritual Studies, IUST in collaboration with Aarafh Foods and Spices is organising a Two-Day International Conference in the month of October 2024 on the theme "The Sīrah of Prophet Muḥammad: Fostering Mutual Respect and Understanding Among World Religions."
